# **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

Just over a month after our third birthday in October 2016, we received the fantastic news that we had achieved our charity status. That was just the start of a what has been a very successful year.



We launched four new Win on Waste sessions in Broadstone, Kinson/West Howe, Oakdale and Westbourne.

We have welcomed 11 new Ambassadors who are doing a great job in helping us to expand our Win on Waste network.

One special collection we ran this year was collecting ties for the Purple Community Fund to send to the Philippines. The women will use the ties to make new items such as bags or cushion covers which will be sold in the UK and the proceeds sent to the Philippines. Altogether we collected 1,432 ties especially those from Poole High School, Good Vibrations and other sources including Win on Waste donors. We organised two very popular literary quizzes which helped us to raise £248. While on the subject of fundraising, thanks to Sean Gabriel, General Manager of Rossmore Leisure Centre, we have a container for our empty aerosol deodorant can collection based at the Centre. These will help to raise much needed funds for us.

I would like to end with thanks. Thanks to my fellow trustees Chris and Jo and to Shaun Robson who served with us for a year. To Sonia Lomax who has volunteered to undertake our payroll, to all our volunteers and Monique Munroe, our Co-ordinator for all their commitment and dedication throughout the year.

# WE NEED THAT—a recycling directory

Six issues have been produced with the September/October issue featuring 38 organisations and five individuals all looking for any of the 87 items in the index.

# WIN ON WASTE—community recycling sessions benefitting good causes with items donated by local people

- Ran 69 sessions (27 sessions ran in 2015/16)
- Started four new sessions in Broadstone, Oakdale, Westbourne and West Howe bringing the total to seven run every month. (In 2015/16 it was four)
- Helped 22 good causes with items they needed
- Each month on average 300 people donate (in 2015/16 it was 70)
- Donations don't just come from local people. This year good causes have benefitted from people saving items in Cornwall, Devon, Kent, Leicestershire, London, Oxfordshire, Worcestershire and even New York.

# POOLE WWF (WORLD WILDLIFE FUND) VOLUNTEER GROUP


The Poole WWF (World Wildlife Fund) Volunteer Group recycles donated goods to raise funds for conservation projects. Thanks to the "We Need That" catalogue and Win on Waste sessions, the number of donations received has increased significantly this year.

We have had over 35 sacks of wrapping paper, maps, calendars, picture frames and toys. We either sell donated items, or recycle eg by creating new pictures to sell from old wildlife calendars and using unwanted maps as wrapping paper for our lucky dip. This has helped us raise nearly £1,000 this year, so far. We look forward to an on-going partnership with Ideas2Action.
